Topic: Leading in a disruptive world

May 25, 2018

1. Length of the paper should not exceed between 8 pages and 10 pages of A4 size paper including tables, figures, list of references, etc.
2. Manuscripts are to be single spaced, top margin and left margin are 1.25”, and below margin and right margin are 1.00”.
3. Manuscripts use **TH Sarabun New** font for the whole paper. More details are as follow:
4. (Title) 16 points with bold and in the middle of the line
Author – size 14 points at the right side
Abstract- size 14 points with bold at the left side
Manuscript of abstract – size 14 points and begin the paragraph with 0.5”
Keyword – at least 3 words, size 14 points

Paper details

- Heading Topic- size 14 point with bold at the left side
- Sub Topic- size 14 point with bold at the left side
- Font size 14 points
- Paragraph at 0.5”

Citations

- The citations must be done in the Harvard Referencing Style (furnishing the last name of the author and year)

If there are several works by the same authors, citations can be made by adding a, b, etc. after the year. Example: (2006a, 2006b)
